Eg. If I purchase a 20-hour package, and my sibling comes with me - and we've both been qualified to use HBOT at the same depth and oxygen (protocol) - I would pay \$4,050 upfront, and our hourly rate would be \$101 instead of \$150.

### NOTES on getting started:

- **Neck seals** and hoods **can be purchased** for each person using the chamber; the cost for a neck seal is \$75;
- **Full hood assemblies** (including tubing) can be purchased for \$200 (see note below);
- HOPE **cleans** all equipment with Sanizide;
- A **doctor's prescription** is required/suggested (call to discuss your situation);
- **Sharing:** If a family member or other individual is cleared for HBOT and shares a session, the 2nd person's rate is ½ price, and both client-patients are charged ½ of the total cost of the session; so, for example, if one person is paying \$120/session and brings another person who is cleared for the chamber, the total cost is \$180, which, when divided by 2, is only \$90/person;
- **Length of Session:** Sessions are generally 1 or 1.5 hours in length. There is no benefit of doing a 1-hour versus a 1.5- or 2-hour session. Some folks choose to do the 1.5 hour session, because it results in fewer visits to Hope (so, we see this being used by folks driving a long distance);
- **Frequency vs. Cumulative Hours:** A common question, 'How frequently should I come?' is addressed in the FAQs on the website. Frequency is cited in studies, as is a protocol (like '100% oxygen at 2.00 ATA for 60 minutes'). We can practice any protocol, no matter the depth or time interval. It is our belief that the cumulative number of hours is what is important – not the frequency of sessions. Sudden hearing loss is one condition where the frequency, though, is important, because we'd want the client-patient to do more sessions closer to the event. For conditions like brain injury, Lyme, autism, and autoimmune conditions, we adhere to 'cumulative over frequency' and



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encourage folks to read medical studies with this in mind: the reason a study will have participants 'dive' 6 or 7 days a week for several weeks is because the study participants (doctors, nurses, documentation specialists, technicians, and patients) can be allocated and scheduled in an orderly fashion over a block of time. What we notice is that 'surprises' are seen more frequently the more frequently 'dives' are scheduled and less frequently the more spread out the 'dives' are but that the total results are the same; thus, we tend to weight the cumulative hours over frequency. In talking with Hope staff and through reading and communicating with your doctor, client-patients are able to decide on an appropriate set of hours;

- **A note on equipment like hoods and neck seals:** Neck seals are the blue latex or non-latex (if you are allergic to latex) snug-fitting part of the hood assembly. They can tear if not handled properly. Please allow two people to assist in putting on and taking off. Replacements are \$65;
